## Red Dress Day 2023 May 5, 2023

WHEREAS	Red Dress Day honours the memory and lives of Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women, Girls and Two-Spirit people across Canada and the US.
WHEREAS	The day has grown into a movement to educate and create awareness and calls to action for systemic change.
WHEREAS	Métis artist Jaime Black helped inspire the red dress movement, where red dresses are hung from windows and trees as a representation of the pain and loss felt by loved ones and survivors.
WHEREAS	Indigenous women and girls are five times more likely to experience violence than any other population in Canada. This is a national crisis that requires urgent, informed and collaborative action.
WHEREAS	Non-Indigenous people have a role to play in the fight for justice for missing and murdered Indigenous women, girls and gender diverse people in this country.
WHEREAS	A Red Dress Campaign is being organized jointly in New Westminster from May 1-31, 2023 by Spirit of the Children Society and the City of New Westminster.
WHEREAS	The City of New Westminster has declared A Year of Truth and encourages New Westminster residents to join the City on its reconciliation journey.
