Based on current strategic priorities, an initial analysis was conducted to guide potential discussions at the FCM Convention. Below are the key federal funding programs that may be of interest to the City, along with FCM funding programs.

It should be noted that federal program and City project timing, as well as eligibility of City projects are key factors to success. Some of the funding programs listed may not be currently open for calls for proposals and illustrate the timing required for city projects to align with Federal funding opportunity. City priority projects will be integrated into an advocacy plan.

The following are examples of project areas the city may want to advance:
