5.1 Public Art Projects Update

Quyen Hoang, Public and Community Art Coordinator, provided an update on Public Art Projects including projects in process and new projects.

In response to questions from Committee members, Ms. Hoang provided the following comments:

- The fencing medium at the Agnes Street Commemorative Park will be determined by the artist; however, it will be non-corrosive and appropriate for the site;
- The Call for the Agnes Street Commemorative Park will be by invitation, led by a curator, will include BC artists, and the budget will not allow for the cost of travel;
- StreetBond 150, which was used at the Joyce/Collingwood Station, will be used for the mural at the Boundary Road Drainage Substation. The mural will span concrete surfaces, buildings, and structures on site; and,

• The public will be able to view the restoration process of the Centennial Totem Pole.
