WHEREAS Indigenous women and girls are five times more likely to

experience violence than any other population in Canada. This is a

national crisis that requires urgent, informed and collaborative

action.

WHEREAS Non-Indigenous people have a role to play in the fight for justice for

missing and murdered Indigenous women, girls and gender diverse

people in this country.

WHEREAS A Red Dress Campaign is being organized jointly in New

Westminster from May 1-31, 2024 by Spirit of the Children Society

and the City of New Westminster.

WHEREAS The City of New Westminster encourages New Westminster

residents to join the City on its reconciliation journey.
