Three Grant Advisory Committees are responsible for reviewing all grant applications and making recommendations to the Chief Administrative Officer for approval. Each Grant Advisory Committee includes a minimum of three and up to ten community content experts representing various sectors within each grant portfolio.

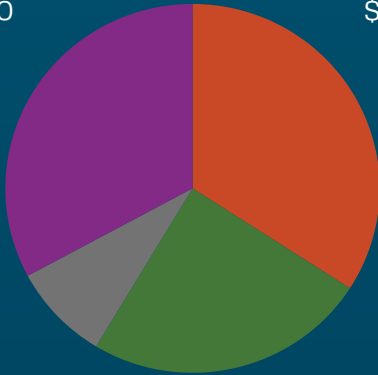
The three Grant Advisory Committees are:

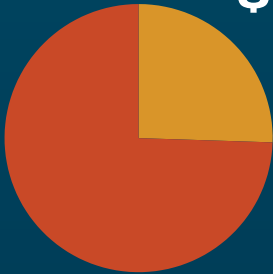

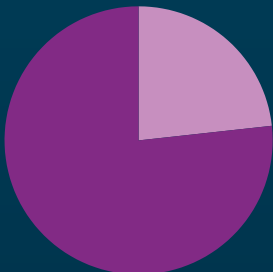
