And the neighbours who live in the area.

Need I remind people that parking is a premium around their houses and those dropping off and picking up children from the schools often makes for dangerous conditions for those on foot. Particularly children. Particularly when raining.

Ah, and the Day Care, which is kiddie corner from the house/lot in question.

All valid and all to the point.

However, I also wish to point out that the City of New Westminster has taken great pains to preserve the core structure of the heritage neighbourhood. Keeping this a calm, quiet neighbourhood for the schools, the pedestrian and the cycle community with traffic calming circles and speed bumps. One of these islands is right outside proposed development.

Preventing trees from being removed by hefting prohibitive fines for removal of a single tree. I have a cluster old evergreens on my property that would cost me well over \$25,000 just for one tree to be removed and my house and neighbour's house are in possible peril.
