In response to questions from the Committee, Mr. Anderson advised:

- The focus for Council on this project is wheeled mobility; however if there are destinations inaccessible for walkers, would like to identify that; and
- When we define safety, we want it to mean that a parent would feel safe enough to have their child use it. One of the reasons safety is often defined by fatalities is it is a challenge to get data to measure things like serious injury.

The Committee was asked to identify groups that should be consulted, and identified that these should include seniors (e.g. via SPARC) and walkers, Blind Beginnings, the Regional Office for CNIB, and students.
